

The committee has meetings four times. In addition to the full committee meetings there have been additional junior squash committee meetings. I have also attended the England Squash County Committee meetings held at various venues in the country and for the first time a a England Squash Area Forum Meeting with representatives from Suffolk, Norfolk, Bedford and Cambridge attending. The program of league fixtures, county matches and tournament events were completed without any major problems. We are supporting a WEB site that is managed by Matt Feilding and the intention is to continue to improve the content of information on the site. There are a number of match reports posted on the WEB and to make it successful it is up to all individuals squash players to contribute with there reports and squash news in Cambridge.

There is a ongoing development of reporting procedures that Teams will need to follow if we are to have up todate results information. There have been teething problem experieced in the reporting of match results on the WEB. This is now resolved and the information on the site is expected to be improved in the forthcomming season.

The Committee continues to support the development of a sustainable junior program that has resulted in a number of impressive results nationally and individually. Under the guidance of Rebbecca Moore the under 15 team gaining recognition by winning the national championships. See Junior Committee report for more details.

Over the year we have had the great loss of Brian Fielding who died following a short illness. Our sympathy goes to his family.

Brian roll as the Squash Development Officer was seeing a revitalising of Squash in the county. In recognition of Brian has contributed to Cambs squash we have named an annual junior tournament in his name.

Squash continues to face the challenge of attracting more players and England Squash are rising to the challenge with a number of initiatives that has included a number of organisational and operational reviews on their role and the whole structure of squash. We should see the effects of these changes over the forthcoming season. Steve Amos has been very supportive and attended a number of committee meetings on behalf of England Squash. The new membership scheme has now been operating for a year and with new England Squash computerized record system clubs will need to ensure that all there members are registered or fall fowl of the league rules that will result in clubs being penalised.

Racket Ball is gaining ground at both local and national levels. There are now more tournaments to enter and hopefully the sport will continue to grow.

Again this year I would like to thank the support I have had from the committee. I know it is left to a dedicated few who invest a lot of time in developing the juniors, running tournaments and making sure we have leagues each year most of which is not seen by the ordinary players. Sadly Micheal Andrews who has servered on the committee for a number of years has left the county to retire in the south. I thank him for his support to Cambs Squash over the years and wish him the best in the future.
